MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: 9: 18 a.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM FEB. 5, 2021:

- Mark made the motion to approve. Linda seconded.
- All approve.

FACILITIES & NEW CONSTRUCTION (PAUL NADEAU)

BROWNELL MS – ACOUSTIC CONSULTANT FOR BAND ROOM

- \$12,500 from Measure E
- Salter Inc.
- Consultant will conduct testing and make recommendations on Aedis' design for this band room. They'll also conduct post-construction testing.
- Next steps: This will go to the board for approval

BROWNELL MS – INDUSTRIAL HYGIENIST AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT MONITORING FOR BAND ROOM

- \$17,298 from Measure E
- EnviroScience
- This monitors the abatement process and conducts air quality tests.
- This is required.
- Next steps: This will go to the board for approval.

ADDITIONAL CAMERAS – CHRISTOPHER HS

- \$10,444.84 from Measure E and site funds
- QoVo, Inc.
- These cameras are for pool area, in conjunction with the additional pool cameras at Gilroy HS.

- We put in additional cameras to cover less pool and more entrance points. Plus, this includes the maintenance room, as per the recommendation of the district pool techs. (60% of the overall quote.)
- In addition, the Christopher HS principal requested two cameras on two courtyards on Cougar Court. These would be paid out of site funds. (40% of the overall quote.)
- The City of Gilroy has a camera system for its part of pool area. Mark requests more information: Does GUSD have access to those cameras? Alvaro will check with Maribel about the system.
 - o Mark would like to see a demo of camera feeds during a future FSC meeting.
- Next steps: This will go to the board. Also: Mark requests a demo of camera feeds for a future committee meeting.

INCREASE IN P.O. FOR NORCAL PORTABLES, INC. - GILROY HS

- \$6,000 from Measure E
- Norcal Portables, Inc.
- The original P.O. had a not-to-exceed amount. This would add more money to the P.O. because the project has gone longer than expected.
- This would keep the fences for at the area until June, when the contractor takes it over and provides the fencing.
- Next steps: This will go the board for approval.

INSPECTOR OF RECORD – SOUTH VALLEY MS

- Amount is TBD from Measure E
- We received two quotes from two inspectors of record: Jerome Zalinski and Fred Powers.
- Fred Powers' quote (\$15K/month for life of project) is significantly lower than Jerome Zalinski (about \$700K or 1% of project budget). The difference is about \$350K.
- Fred was brought in for a preliminary interview and a site walk. Paul interviewed some first references and they've checked out so far. He has some experience with schools.
- What has Jerome helped out that is beyond the project scope? Dan: Maintenance has consulted
 with him a couple times a month for things like the CHS woodshop, HVAC assessments and
 upcoming projects.
- Linda's concerned with the price difference. Is he of the same caliber as Zalinski?
- Paul pointed out that the South Valley MS project is under the 2019 building code, which increases the required special inspections.
- The concern is whether going with someone new to the district for such a big project.
- Dr. Flores: Please ask Fred if he's ever worked for the district as well as any other districts he's worked for.
- Alvaro: If Powers is recommended, more information about Powers' project history should be included in the board briefing. We can switch out IORs mid-project, under a specific process, but it's doable. We would have to figure out a new IOR, though, and we'd be
- Alvaro: Make sure their proposals are "apples to apples" that is they are bidding on the same terms, etc. Jerome has included time and costs for close-outs, etc. that Fred hasn't.
- It should go to the board by May; June at the latest.

 Next steps: The committee recommends that Powers' qualifications and references are thoroughly vetted.

SOILS MANAGEMENT ENGINEERING – SOUTH VALLEY MS

- \$45,960 from Measure E
- Padre Associates
- This is the CEQA process to remove contaminated soils from the site in preparation for construction.
- Removal action work (RAW) plan.
- This process is phased and would get started as soon as possible.
- Padre will walk us through all of the public notifications need to go out the neighborhood.
- Next steps: This will go the board for approval.

PRE-CONSTRUCTION AGREEMENT AMENDMENT – SOUTH VALLEY MS

- \$1.140M from Measure E
- Flint Builders, Inc.
- Hummingbird has been selected as the modular builder of the classroom buildings.
- This adds Hummingbird's pre-construction costs of \$790K (design, development and certification). This amount is added to the original pre-con of about \$350K for total of \$1.14M.
- Next steps: This will go the board for approval.

SCHOOL CLEANUP AGREEMENT - SOUTH VALLEY MS

- \$ 77,563 from Measure E
- Department of Toxic Substance Control (DTSC).
- This is the government part of the soils management process. This agency gives the final certification. Padre will work with DTSC.
- We did about \$100K of this work with government grant.
- Next steps: This will go to the board for approval.

FACILITIES – MAAS DATA FIELD ELEMENTS MAPPING FOR AUTO IMPORTATION

- \$3,500 from Measure E
- MAAS
- This will help migrate data from one platform to another.
- This enables the financial data to automatically update from QSS (county payment system) to MAAS.
- This is for about 20 hours of work. Paul hopes for it to be done in 15 or less hours.
- Next steps: This will go to the board for approval.

MAINTENANCE (DAN MCAULIFFE)

DISTRICT-WIDE – HVAC ASSESSMENT UPDATE

• We are in phase 2. It is going well.

- Christopher HS has been certified and is 100%. Gilroy HS is close; waiting on parts for repairs for XY building, after elementary schools and preschools are done.
- We are installing MERV11 now. We also have supplier of MERV13 available. We've ordered filters for Rod Kelley ES to test them. If we like them, we will order for whole district.
- Dan doesn't anticipate many issues at the elementary schools. Luigi and Rod Kelley are going now; Las Animas and Eliot are expected to be fast. We've encountered minor repairs at Glen View and Rucker; parts are on the way.
- Dan and Val's have strategized how to do this in the fastest, most efficient way possible. Val's has tapped out its team is working at its limit. Dan and team are aiming for completion by end of March but says realistically it may be closer to April 12.
- The concern is South Valley MS and what the findings will be at that site. Would HEPA air purifiers help this site?
 - o Alvaro: Order more of the larger, classroom-sized filters.
- Next steps: Dan will follow up with Leeanna Hammer to order more HEPA air purifiers.

ALVARO MEZA'S ITEMS

SOUTH COUNTY ANNEX – SCCOE SOUTH COUNTY PROJECT REQUEST

- With the South Valley MS project, we needed to find a new home for the Gilroy Neighborhood Clinic. SCCOE has reached a potential solution by housing them at the South County Annex/former ADB site.
- The proposal would retrofit the lobby area to house the clinic.
- The county would be responsible to restoring the rooms to the condition that they first leased it.
- The clinic will actually more exam rooms here than at South Valley MS.
- Clinic administration has asked if they can take cabinetry and maybe other items from South Valley MS to the annex. It would be items that would be removed and possibly thrown out anyway during the modernization project. It's a win-win for the clinic and district.
- Mark: Please include the original agreement with the board briefing.
- Next steps: This will go the board for approval.

OTHER PROJECTS/FACILITY ISSUES AT SITES

SOUTH COUNTY ANNEX / FORMER ANTONIO DEL BUONO ES

• We are keeping an eye on roof issues at this site. First built in 1999. It's on the target list to be replaced in two or three years. We've had some leak issues. We have two roofs at this site. The built-up roof (flat areas) is at the end of its life expectancy. The metal roof, while it should last indefinitely, has had issues because of shifting, not materials. Budgeted cost: \$320K.

As an Independent Contractor with a DSA Class 1 Certification, I would like to make the following proposal to provide my inspection services for the future South Valley Middle School Campus Replacement project in Gilroy, CA:

I'm proposing a monthly flat rate of \$15,000 per month payable on a 30-day monthly schedule. Your current estimated project schedule was noted as 23 months which will equate to a total of \$345,000 for a 23 month schedule. Any approved added scope beyond the noted 23 month schedule will remain at the approved \$15,000 per month.

The aforementioned \$15,000 per month is based a rate similar to \$85/hr., but for unlimited hours each and every month of the entire project. No overtime or premium rate will be required or ever requested throughout the entire project.

Note: Any Professional E&O insurance required by the District will be an added monthly reimbursable cost to the District per the most cost effective predetermined rate.

Division of the State Architect (DSA) documents referenced within this publication are available on the DSA Forms or DSA Publications webpages.

PURPOSE: This Interpretation of Regulations (IR) provides clarification of specific Code requirements relating to the approval of assistant inspectors. All assistant inspectors must complete a two-step process of (1) certification and (2) approval by DSA, before they are permitted to work on a school construction project.

IR A-7: Inspector Certification and Approval explains the requirements for DSA certification for all inspectors. IR A-7 also explains the requirements for project approval of project inspectors. This IR specifies requirements for project approval of assistant inspectors.

BACKGROUND: There are three types of inspectors who may perform code-required inspections on DSA-regulated projects:

- Project Inspectors are responsible for ensuring that all code-prescribed inspections and
 administrative duties are completed, including supervision of assistant inspectors and
 monitoring of special inspectors. The DSA-certified Class 1 or 2 project inspector may utilize
 one or more assistant inspectors to assist in performing inspection and administrative duties
 on a project.
- Assistant Inspectors may be utilized, or may be required, to assist a DSA certified Class 1 or 2 project inspector by providing inspection and/or administrative assistance to the project inspector on a project. An assistant inspector must be qualified by obtaining DSA certification as a project inspector. Qualified assistants must be approved by DSA for each project as explained in Section 3 below.
- **Special Inspectors** are specially qualified persons utilized, where required by code, to inspect specific aspects of the work such as structural steel welding or masonry construction. A special inspector may be hired by the laboratory of record or through an independent contract with the school district or owner. Refer to California Administrative Code (CAC) Section 4-335(f) and *IR 17-12: Special Inspection Reporting Requirements*, etc. for additional information.

INTERPRETATION:

1. UTILIZATION OF ASSISTANT INSPECTORS: On larger, more complex, or fast-paced projects, the necessity to utilize assistant inspectors must be assessed. For example, the need for an assistant inspector should be discussed with the DSA field engineer when construction cost exceeds \$15,000,000. DSA's approval of the project inspector may be contingent upon adequate provision for assistant inspectors.

The scope of all construction work that the assistant inspector will inspect and any other codeprescribed duties that they will perform must be described on form *DSA 5-AI: Assistant Inspector Qualification and Approval.*

- 2. REQUIREMENTS FOR THE USE OF AN ASSISTANT INSPECTOR: DSA has established the following requirements for the certification, approval, and use of any assistant inspector on a public school construction project.
- **2.1** Only DSA-certified Class 1 or 2 project inspectors may utilize assistant inspectors.
- 2.2 The project inspector must provide continuous on-site supervision of all assistant inspectors as described in *IR A-8: Project Inspector and Assistant Inspector Duties and Performance*. The project inspector shall not assign the assistant inspector to inspect work at a project site when the project inspector will not be present unless special written DSA approval is obtained in advance.

3. CERTIFICATION AND APPROVAL OF AN ASSISTANT INSPECTOR – A TWO-STEP PROCESS

- **3.1 Securing DSA Certification:** DSA certification as a Class 1, 2, 3 or 4 project inspector is the first step in becoming an assistant inspector. See IR A-7 and DSA's website for more information regarding DSA certification requirements.
- 3.2 Project Approval: An assistant inspector must be approved by DSA for each specific project. An Assistant Inspector Qualification and Approval form DSA 5-Al must be submitted to the appropriate DSA Regional Office for approval at least 10 working days prior to use of the assistant inspector on the project. The basic criteria for qualification and approval of an assistant inspector contained within form DSA 5-Al can be summarized as follows. An assistant inspector must:
 - Be DSA-certified as a Class 1, 2, 3 or 4 project inspector.
 - Have work experience in inspection or construction associated with the trades that the assistant inspector will be inspecting unless otherwise agreed to by DSA.
 - Demonstrate that their current workload and time commitment to the project are acceptable (refer to IR A-7 for additional information about requirements for working on multiple projects and notifying DSA about workload changes during the project).
 - Have demonstrated satisfactory performance on previous school construction projects (refer to IR A-8).

The assistant inspector must maintain their DSA Project Inspector certification throughout the duration of assignment to any project.

The Design Professional in General Responsible Charge is advised to consult with the DSA field engineer prior to submittal of the form DSA 5-Al to DSA, in order to verify that the prospective assistant inspector meets the criteria for approval by DSA for the project.

4. PROJECT AND ASSISTANT INSPECTOR RESPONSIBILITIES: A project inspector is responsible for ensuring that all code-prescribed inspection and administrative duties are completed per IR A-7 and IR A-8. The assistant inspector is responsible for performing assigned inspections in a similar manner. Both the project inspector and assistant inspector must keep a log of time spent on-site.

When an assistant inspector is utilized on a project the project inspector and assistant inspector must both be identified on the Project Inspector Semi-Monthly Report (form DSA 155: Project Inspector Semi-Monthly Report).

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5. **OBSERVATION OF CONSTRUCTION BY DSA:** The DSA field engineer observes the project and the project inspector's and assistant inspector's performance of code-prescribed duties during the course of construction, including the project inspector's monitoring of the assistant inspector's performance. See IR A-8 for detailed information about DSA construction oversight activities.

This IR indicates an acceptable method for achieving compliance with applicable codes and regulations, although other methods proposed by design professionals may be considered by DSA.

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AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONALSERVICES WITH Flint Builders Inc.

In connection with the Agreement for Professional Services dated as of 6/18/2019 (the "Original Agreement") between the GILROY UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT (the "District") and Flint Builders Inc. ("Consultant"), which consists of the Original Agreement, the Proposal relating to the Original Agreement, and several Exhibits, Consultant and the District hereby amend the Original Agreement pursuant to this Amendment No. 1(the "Amendment," and together with the Original Agreement, the "Agreement"), by and between the District and Consultant, as follows:

- 1. **Compensation**. The amount specified as compensation in the Original Agreement is hereby deleted and replaced with the following amount: \$58,378,386. Payment of the fee shall remain subject to the process for Compensation specified in the Original Agreement and the rates or schedule of fees specified in **Exhibit B** thereto.
- 2. **Services**. The services, as needed and requested by the District, described in **Exhibit A** of the Original Agreement are hereby amended. The revised **Exhibit A** is incorporated herein by this reference.

The Services described herein constitute additional services within the meaning of the Original Agreement.

3. **Termination**. If the Original Agreement was entered into prior to June 1, 2020, the Termination provision, if any, is hereby *deleted and replaced in its entirety* with the following Termination and Suspension provision. If the Original Agreement did not include a Termination provision, the following provision is hereby *inserted* as an independent clause.

Termination and Suspension.

- a. **For Cause.** If Consultant fails to perform its obligations under this Agreement, the District will provide written notice specifying each breach for which notice is being given. If Consultant fails to cure such breach(es) within 14 days of such notice (or to make arrangements for cure that are satisfactory to the District, if the breach is such that more than 14 days are required to cure), then the District may elect to terminate this Agreement for cause. Any such termination for cause will become effective upon the date set forth in the District's written notice to Consultant of its election to terminate.
- b. For Convenience. 2021 All-Inclusive Playground Grant Annual Report Gilroy Unified School District

Gilroy Unified School District was awarded All-Inclusive Playground Grant funds that will enabled us to replace outdated playground equipment at three elementary schools with new, start of the art, accessible equipment and play surfaces. The schools benefiting from the AIPG projects are Rod Kelley Elementary, El Roble Elementary, and Glen View Elementary. We have honored the unique community at each school through the use of different designs and themes that tie in to the school colors and mascot. In addition to the expanded accessibility of these playgrounds, the designs we selected also offer musical stations, individual and group game panels, language education panels, and interactive play equipment never before offered at a GUSD school site. The completed AIPG playgrounds are sure to be a highlight of our students' experience at these schools, and foster creative play for many years to come.

GUSD partnered with Specialized Play Equipment Co. for the playground designs and procurement of the playground equipment, and Playgrounds Unlimited was selected as the contractor for site work and installation. All playgrounds will receive a final inspection by a Certified Playground Safety Inspector upon completion. We were able to work with Burke, the play equipment manufacturer, to design custom signs acknowledging that the projects were made possible by the AIPG program. Proofs of these signs in both English and Spanish were reviewed and approved by the AIPG program team and will be placed at each playground. The COVID-19 related school closures at all three locations allowed us to schedule construction during daytime hours Monday through Friday since students were not present, and shortened the overall schedule we had planned for. As of April 1st, 2021 all three playground projects are underway and, barring any future weather delays, will be complete by May 1st, 2021. We anticipate receiving our final invoices from the project vendors in May and will seek reimbursement for each of the three projects in July.

Rod Kelley Elementary School

The AIPG playground project at Rod Kelley broke ground on February 16th and is anticipated to be complete by April 8th. The playground has been customized for that school by incorporating a knight logo and castle themed tower as part of the main play structure, giving a clear indication that this is the home of the Rod Kelley Knights. This playground will serve up to 776 students in grades K-5. To date we have paid invoices totaling \$199,380.62 for this site, which accounts for 100% of the design development, play equipment, stone look plastic borders and ADA access ramp for a wood fiber filled area and all material freight. We anticipate receiving an invoice for the balance of the contract with SPEC, \$242,327.73 in late April or early May.

El Roble Elementary

The AIPG playground project at EI Roble broke ground on February 22nd and is anticipated to be complete by April 23rd. The El Roble Mighty Oaks will feel right at home in a treehouse themed play structure with images of trees incorporated into the signage, and leaves designed into the rubber play surface. This playground will serve up to 691 students in grades K-5. To date we have paid invoices totaling \$207,348.52 for this site, which accounts for 100% of the design development, play equipment, stone look plastic borders and ADA access ramp for a wood fiber filled area and all material freight. A second invoice for the demolition, excavation, base rock and concrete work is anticipated in April for approximately \$76,800 and the balance of the contract billed for in May.

Glen View Elementary

The AIPG playground project at Glen View broke ground on March 1st and is anticipated to be complete by May 14th. Images of soaring birds on the play panels, and the blue and white school colors throughout the play surface and play structure will leave no doubt that this is the home of the Glen View Eagles. By reconfiguring the way the original playground footprint is utilized we have been able to build a beautiful new playground and set aside a portion of the area for the school to use as a future student garden area. This playground will serve up to 703 students in grades K-5. To date we have paid invoices totaling \$201,006.20 for this site, which accounts for 100% of the design development, play equipment, and freight. A second invoice for approximately \$77,000 for the majority of site work is anticipated to be received in April, and a final invoice by the end of May.

If this occurs outside of normal business hours, the mobilization fee will be \$900.

MTM will conduct a follow-up tree survey for all schools within the Gilroy unified school district. These tree survey will start with a site walk-through of all school properties, using previous main report as a guide to identify trees, possible hazards, and pruning/removal needs. The report focus will be on safety of trees, as they are on school grounds, and long-term care of trees.

Goals of report:

- 1.) Risk assessment-Assess tree health based on visual survey. This will identify hazards and possible impacts of tree or branch failure.

Focused Transportation Study for South Valley Middle School Modernization

Dear Mr. Nadeau;

As requested, W-Trans has prepared a focused transportation study for the proposed modernization of the South Valley Middle School campus located at 385 I.O.O.F. Avenue in Gilroy. According to the Transportation Impact Analysis guidelines published by the Santa Clara County Valley Transportation Authority, the preparation of a Transportation Impact Analysis (TIA) is not required since this project would generate fewer than 100 a.m. or p.m. peak hour trips. Instead, a focused transportation study was prepared to evaluate issues related to site access, trip generation and vehicle miles traveled. It is also noted that at the time of the preparation of this letter, the region was observing a shelter in place protocol and in-person school instruction at this campus was reduced.

Project Description

The Gilroy Unified School District (GUSD) plans to reconfigure access to the campus by relocating the school driveways from their current locations on I.O.O.F. Avenue to Murray Avenue as part of a campus modernization plan. The intent of moving the access points is to alleviate congestion on I.O.O.F. Avenue by shifting the school access further away from the neighboring Gilroy Prep School and the District maintenance and transportation department, both of which have driveways on I.O.O.F. Avenue. South Valley Middle School currently serves approximately 800 students. This level of enrollment is expected to remain unchanged in the future with the implementation of the campus modernization plan.

Local Roadways

I.O.O.F Avenue is a two-lane east-west major collector that provides access between Murray Avenue and Monterey Road. Primary access to the Gilroy Prep School, South Valley Middle School and numerous single-family homes is provided by I.O.O.F. Avenue. I.O.O.F. Avenue has a posted speed limit of 25 miles per hour (mph). Onstreet parking is permitted on both sides of I.O.O.F. Avenue between Murray Avenue and Forest Street.

Murray Avenue is a two-lane north-south major collector that provides access between Cohansey Avenue and Lewis Street. The posted speed limit is 35 mph, except near the South Valley Middle School campus where the speed limit is 25 mph. Near South Valley Middle School, on-street parking is permitted on both sides of Murray Avenue. Based on counts conducted in the Fall of 2018, approximately 8,200 vehicles use the segment Murray Avenue adjacent to the school each day.

Alternative Transportation Modes

Pedestrians

Pedestrian facilities include sidewalks, crosswalks, pedestrian signal phases, curb ramps, and various streetscape amenities such as lighting, benches, etc. In general, a complete network of sidewalks, crosswalks, pedestrian signals, and curb ramps provides access for pedestrians in the vicinity of South Valley Middle School.

The proposed modernization plan would change the campus so that the main entrance would be facing Murray Avenue.

Recommendation – To enhance pedestrian safety, it is recommended that an additional crosswalk be provided on Murray Avenue adjacent to the main entrance to the school at Polk Court. This crosswalk would be placed approximately 360 feet north of the existing crosswalk at I.O.O.F. Avenue and would provide more direct access between the school and the neighborhood east of Murray Avenue.

Bicycle Network

The Highway Design Manual, Caltrans, 2017, classifies bikeways into four categories:

- Class I Multi-Use Path a completely separated right-of-way for the exclusive use of bicycles and pedestrians
 with cross flows of motorized traffic minimized.
- Class II Bike Lane a striped and signed lane for one-way bike travel on a street or highway.
- **Class III Bike Route** signing only for shared use with motor vehicles within the same travel lane on a street or highway.
- Class IV Bikeway also known as a separated bikeway, a Class IV Bikeway is for the exclusive use of bicycles
 and includes a separation between the bikeway and the motor vehicle traffic lane. The separation may
 include, but is not limited to, grade separation, flexible posts, inflexible physical barriers, or on-street parking.

In the immediate project area, Class II bike lanes exist on Murray Avenue between Lincoln Court and I.O.O.F. Avenue as well as on Forest Street between I.O.O.F Avenue and East 9th Street. Bicyclists ride in the roadway and/or on sidewalks along all other streets within the project study area.

Transit Facilities

The Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) provides fixed route bus service and light rail train service in Santa Clara County. Two bicycles can be carried on VTA light rail trains and most VTA buses. Bike rack space is on a first come, first served basis. Additional bicycles are allowed on VTA buses at the discretion of the driver.

VTA Route 68 provides local bus service between the Gilroy Transit Center and San Jose Diridon Station via Monterey Road. This route operates daily with buses every 15 to 20 minutes from 4:30 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. on weekdays and from 5:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. on weekends. The nearest stop is located on Monterey Road approximately 1,500 feet from the South Valley Middle School campus.

Dial-a-ride, also known as paratransit, or door-to-door service, is available for those who are unable to independently use the transit system due to a physical or mental disability. VTA Paratransit is designed to serve the needs of individuals with disabilities within the City of Gilroy and greater Santa Clara County.

Trip Generation

There are approximately 800 students currently enrolled at the school, and future enrollment is not expected to change with the campus modernization plan. Therefore, the number of vehicle trips attributable to the school is

also not expected to change with the planned project. However, to support the vehicular access study and evaluate the relocation of trips in the area during this time of limited activity on campus, the trip generation for the school was estimated using standard rates published by the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) in *Trip Generation Manual*, 10th Edition, 2017 for "Middle School/Junior High School)" (ITE LU #522). These results are summarized in Table 1.

Finding – The proposed campus modernization plan would neither increase or decrease the number of vehicle trips expected to or from the school.

Traffic Count

The directional peak hour and bidirectional average daily traffic (ADT) on surrounding street segments was determined based on 24-hour counts conducted on a typical weekday while schools were in session. These counts, provided by City of Gilroy staff, were gathered on multiple days in 2018 starting on Tuesday, September 18 and ending Wednesday, September 20. Detailed count summaries for both Murray Avenue and I.O.O.F. Avenue are enclosed. The average volumes obtained from these counts are summarized in Table 2.

Collision Rate

A summary of collision rates along I.O.O.F. Avenue and Murray Avenue was published in the City of Gilroy Engineering & Traffic Survey (E&TS) prepared by TJKM in May 2019 for the five-year period from January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2017. As documented in the E&TS report, these roadway segments demonstrated collision rates higher than the statewide average for similar facilities. A summary for each roadway is shown in Table 3.

Site Circulation and Access

Site Access

Vehicular access to the school is currently provided by five driveways on I.O.O.F Avenue. There are also three driveways located on Murray Avenue serving four auxiliary buildings unrelated to school operations. The proposed campus modernization plan would reconfigure the campus by removing the auxiliary non-school buildings and orienting the front of the school so that it faces Murray Avenue. Under the proposed plan, there would be one ingress-only driveway and one egress-only driveway on I.O.O.F Avenue and two ingress-only driveways on Murray Avenue, as shown in the enclosed preliminary site plan.

The proposed campus improvements would be include three separate parking lots. The north parking lot adjacent to Murray Avenue would be designated for staff parking and school bus access only. The south parking lot on Murray Avenue would serve as the primary student drop-off and pick-up area. The remaining parking lot along I.O.O.F. Avenue would be designated for staff use only; student drop-off and pick-ups would be discouraged or prohibited within this area.

The curbside student drop-off and pick-up area may become congested during the morning and afternoon periods immediately before and after school operating hours. To alleviate the anticipated congestion, it is recommended that vehicles exiting the driveway be limited to right-turn movements only.

Recommendation – To maximize efficient egress from the drop-off and pick-up lane area in the south parking lot, it is recommended that the driveway exit onto Murray Street be limited to right-turn movements only.

Sight Distance

At driveways, a substantially clear line of sight should be maintained between the driver of a vehicle waiting at the crossroad and the driver of an approaching vehicle. Sight distance along Murray Avenue and I.O.O.F. Avenue at each project driveway was evaluated based on sight distance criteria contained in the *Highway Design Manual* published by Caltrans. The recommended sight distances for driveways are based on stopping sight distance, which uses the approach travel speeds as the basis for determining the recommended sight distance. The posted "school zone" speed limit on Murray Avenue near the project site is 25 mph, and therefore the minimum stopping sight distance needed is 150 feet.

Based on a review of field conditions and project plans, the sight distances at the proposed egress driveways along Murray Avenue would exceed 150 feet in each direction. However, this may be hindered at times by on-street parking and landscaping.

Finding – Sight distances along Murray Avenue and I.O.O.F. Avenue at each project driveway is adequate for the posted speed limit.

Recommendation – To maintain a minimum sight distance of 150 feet at each driveway access point, it is recommended that any vegetation near the project's driveways should be trimmed to an appropriate height of less than three feet and trees trimmed so that nothing hangs below a height of seven feet from the surface of the roadway. Also, on-street parking should be restricted for at least 40 feet on both sides of each driveway.

Murray Avenue Turn Lane Evaluation

In designing an intersection or driveway entrance, left-turning traffic should be removed from the through lanes whenever practical. Ideally, left-turn lanes should be provided at street intersections or driveways along major arterial and high-volume collector roads wherever left turns are permitted. Left-turn facilities such as two-way

left-turn lanes (TWLTL) or separated left turn lanes should be established on roadways where traffic volumes are high enough to warrant them.

Continuous TWLTL's separate left-turning vehicles from through traffic, which can reduce delay to through vehicles and can lead to a reduction in rear-end and sideswipe collisions. TWLTL's also provide spatial separation between opposing lanes of traffic, which can lead to a reduction in head-on collisions. These lanes can also function as a by-pass lane for emergency vehicles.

Unfortunately, neither the California MUTCD nor the Caltrans *Highway Design Manual* offers specific guideline for the application of two-way left-turn lanes. However, the Kentucky Transportation Center developed a set of recommended thresholds for consideration of TWLTL implementation. The following list summarizes key recommendations which are applicable to Murray Avenue:

- Operating speeds of 45 mph or less
- Average Daily Traffic (ADT) of 17,000 or less for a two-lane facility
- 10 or more access points per mile
- Maximum access density of 85 points per mile
- Minimum TWLTL length of 425 feet

Murray Avenue along the school campus frontage would satisfy the conditions recommended by the Kentucky Transportation Center for TWLTL implementation because the operating speeds are less than 45 mph, the ADT is less than 17,000, there are nearly 10 driveway access points and it has a length of at least 425 feet. Further, this segment of roadway was identified as having a collision rate higher than the statewide average for similar facilities. As such, Murray Avenue satisfies the criteria for implementation of a TWLTL.

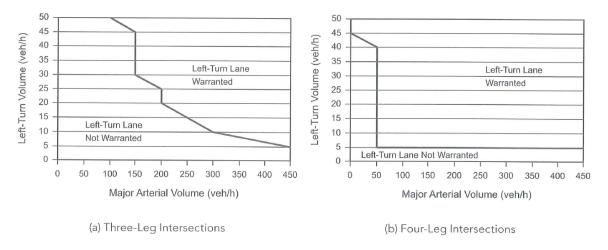


Figure 9-35. Suggested Left-Turn Lane Warrants Based on Results from Benefit–Cost Evaluations for Intersections on Arterials in Urban Areas (*16*)

The values from the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials' (AASHTO) *A Policy on Geometric Design of Highways and Streets*, 2018 ("Green Book"), Figure 9-35 were used to determine whether a dedicated left-turn lane would be recommended at the drop-off lane driveway on Murray Avenue. It should be noted that the satisfaction of the volume-based guidelines or warrants presented in the AASHTO Green Book may indicate situations where a left-turn lane may be desirable, but not necessarily situations where a left-turn lane is definitely needed. Site-specific conditions need to be evaluated to determine the feasibility of adding a turn lane and whether the physical constraints along the road make the addition of a turn lane practical or not. The anticipated vehicle volumes during the a.m. and school p.m. peak hour would satisfy the volume thresholds defined by AASHTO at the drop-off lane entrance driveway on Murray Avenue, indicating that a dedicated left-turn lane (or TWLTL) may be desirable. A copy of Figure 9-35 is enclosed.

Additionally, this portion of Murray Avenue has an observed collision rate of 6.45 collisions per million vehicle miles (C/MVM) which is higher than the statewide average of 2.21 C/MVM for similar roadways. The addition of either a dedicated left-turn lane or TWLTL may also help reduce the frequency of crashes along Murray Avenue.

Due to the geometric constraints of Murray Avenue, implementation of either a TWLTL or separate left-turn lane may require the removal of on-street parking along this segment of the roadway.

Finding –The anticipated number of left turning vehicle movements entering the school drop-off or pick-up area on Murray Avenue, combined with the overall geometric characteristics of the roadway, would satisfy the conditions defined by AASHTO and the Kentucky Transportation Center for consideration of a separate left turn lane.

Recommendation – The lane striping of Murray Avenue should be modified to include a two-way left-turn lane (or similar feature) between I.O.O.F. Avenue and approximately 100 feet north of Adams Court. A TWLTL would

be expected to improve access at all driveways and side streets along this segment of Murray Avenue. It is noted that on-street parking would likely be impacted to accommodate this improvement.

Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) Evaluation

Senate Bill (SB) 743 established a change in the metric to be applied for determining traffic impacts associated with development projects. Rather than the delay-based criteria associated with a Level of Service analysis, the increase in Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) as a result of a project is now the basis for determining impacts under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Because the City of Gilroy has not yet adopted a standard of significance for evaluating VMT, comparable guidance provided by the Cities of Los Altos, San Jose, as well as Sacramento and Contra Costa Counties was used. Guidance adopted by Los Altos, Sacramento County and Contra Costa County states that neighborhood-based schools are presumed to have a less-than-significant impact on vehicle miles traveled. The policy for San Jose states that schools with no net change in VMT would be considered to have a less-than-significant VMT impact.

The proposed project would be expected to result in no net change in VMT since the number of enrolled students would not increase with the campus modernization plan nor would the attendance boundaries change. Future students are likely to have similar travel patterns as current students, further strengthening the conclusion that the project would result in no net change to the total vehicle miles traveled.

Based on this assessment, the proposed campus modernization can be classified as a local-serving land use and as having no net change in vehicle miles traveled. Based on the previously summarized standards, the proposed project may be presumed to result in a less-than-significant VMT impact.

Finding – The project is anticipated to result in a less-than-significant impact on vehicle miles traveled.

Conclusions and Recommendations

- A new crosswalk on Murray Avenue approximately 360 feet north of I.O.O.F Avenue at Polk Court is recommended.
- Nearby bicycle, and transit facilities would be adequate to serve the project.
- The proposed project would not alter the expected number of vehicle trips arriving to or departing from the school.
- To maximize efficient egress from the drop-off and pick-up lane area, it is recommended that the driveway exit onto Murray Street be limited to right-turn movements only.
- To maintain a minimum sight distance of 150 feet at each driveway access point, it is recommended that any vegetation near the project's driveways should be trimmed to an appropriate height of less than three feet and trees trimmed so that nothing hangs below a height of seven feet from the surface of the roadway. Also, on-street parking should be restricted for at least 40 feet on both sides of each driveway.
- A continuous two-way left-turn lane is recommended along the segment of Murray Avenue adjacent to the school. It should be noted that the availability of on-street parking would be impacted to accommodate the creation of a two-way left-turn lane.
- The proposed project would have a less-than-significant transportation impact on vehicle miles traveled.

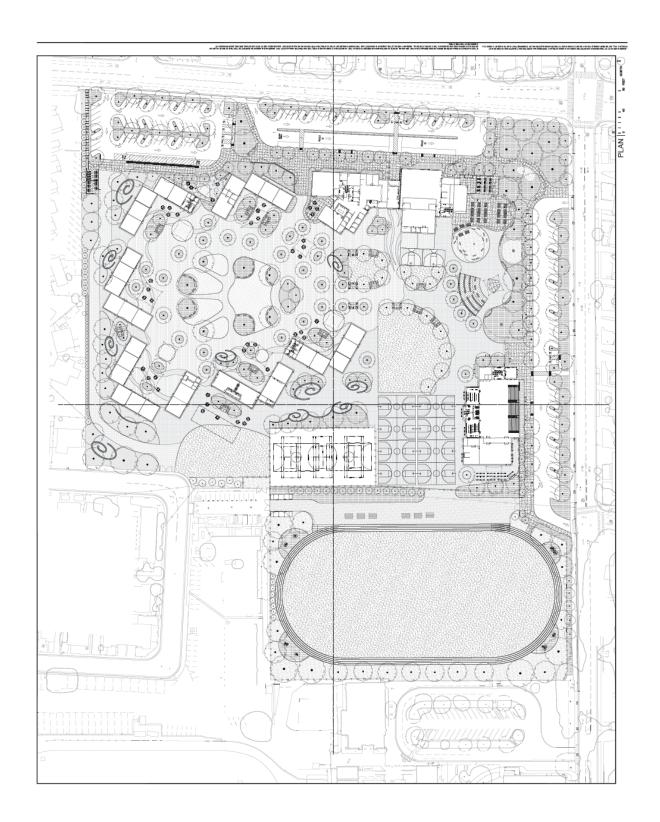

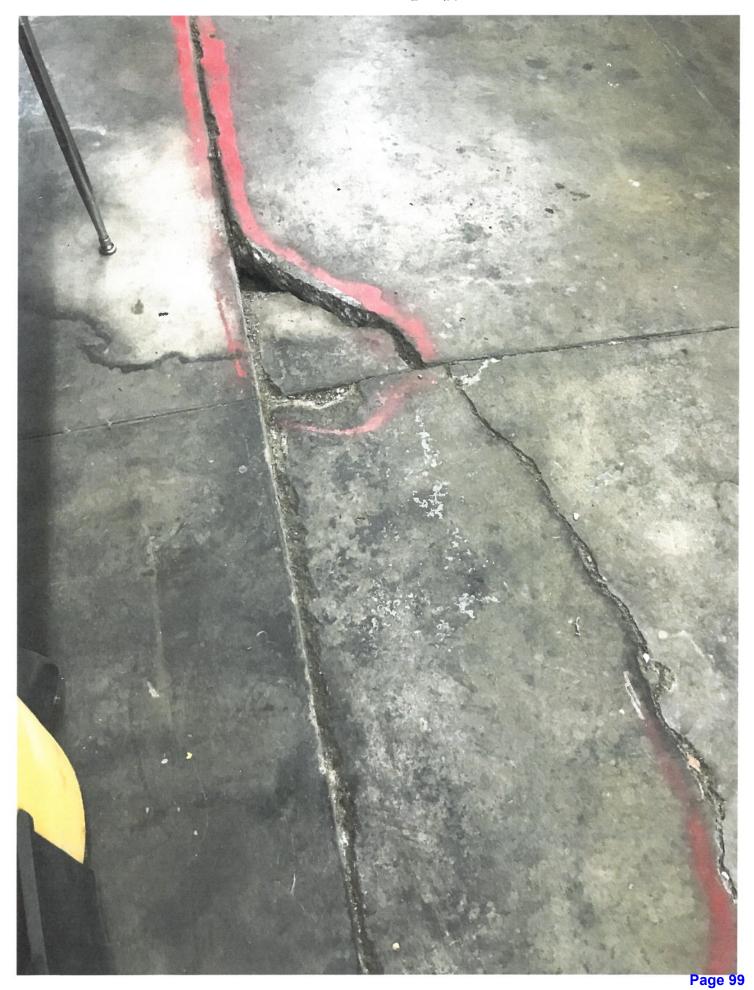

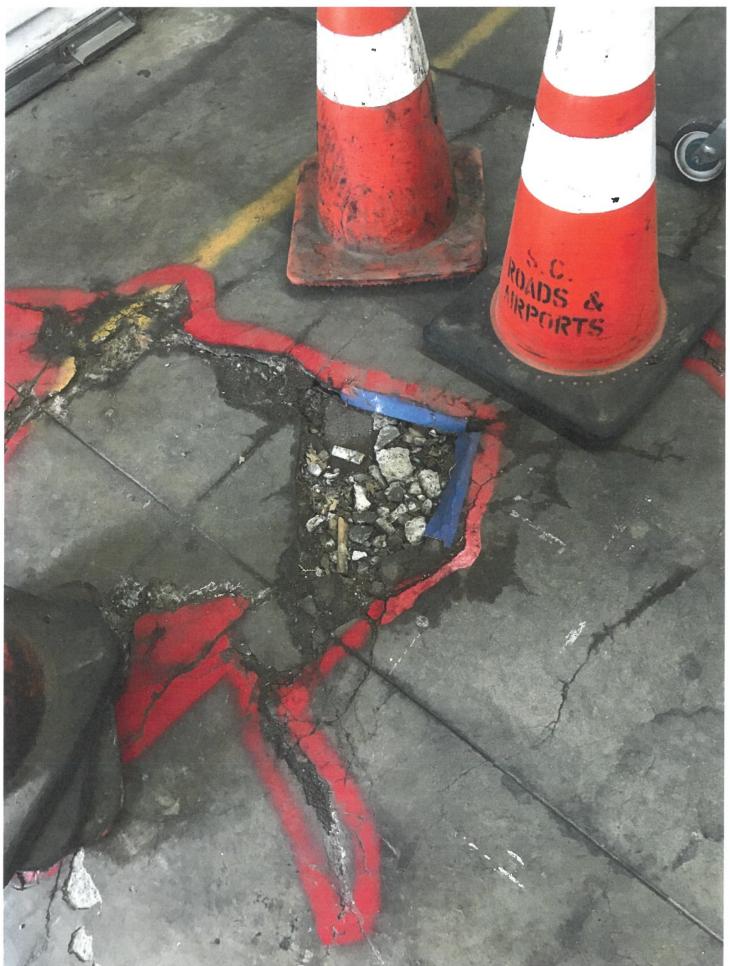

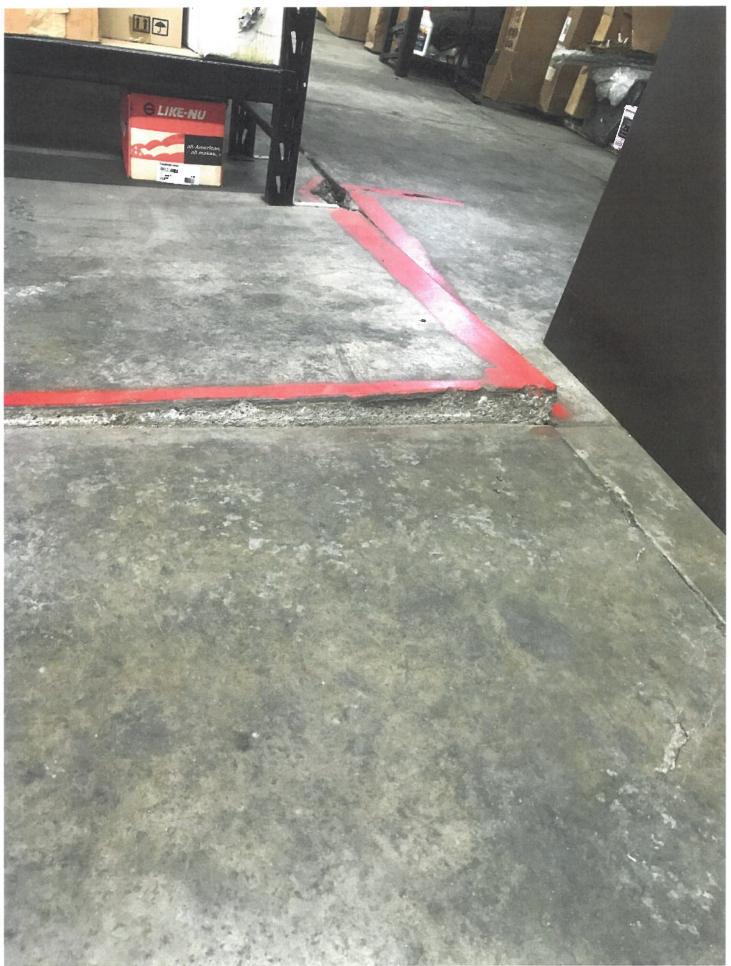
