MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: 9:40 a.m.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM AUG. 7, 2020

- BC made the motion to approve the minutes. Linda seconded.
- All in favor.

#### TIME CERTAIN: AEDIS ARCHITECTS ON SOUTH VALLEY MS MODERNIZATION PROJECT

- Aedis team: Joe Vela, John Diffenderfer, Andrew Mikkelsen, Eve Olimpo, Matt Puckett.
- Have met with SVMS departments in access needs in series of gatherings with site admins.
- Discussed traffic flows, visitors.
- Preliminary square footage: 25,000. Projected budget, based on this preliminary square footage: \$89M.
- Timeline: Ahead of timeline because contractor will be on board sooner than projected.
- Five major design ideas emerged from this stage of work:
  - Entrance on Murray with prominent admin building. Also, some preference has emerged for the admin, library and MPR to be connected as a main façade. Also, allow for outside access to facilities like MPR and gym with ability to restrict access to rest of campus;
  - Academic areas around a central quad;
  - Amphitheater;
  - Gym in SW corner of site;
  - No through access across campus.
- Aedis presented preliminary concepts that were developed from input from these meetings.
- Dr. Flores would like to see a school with an interior lobby, like the one shown in the concept. Aedis said they'll research if any are in Santa Clara County.
- Linda said she's concerned about the trees and amphitheater in the concept. Is that much space being dedicated to this area? It's too much land for this. Dr. Flores would like to set up a time to physically see this part of the campus, the space between the trees.
- Dr. Flores will follow up with Alvaro to see if he knows how many students use the back entrance of the campus. Linda suggests looking at current 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> graders.

- Linda: One idea was to flip the admin and library so that the admin had a better view of the campus. Is that still being considered? Also, remember to take into account the neighborhood needs and community.
- These concepts have been shown to staff on the committee. They've provided input.
- Next steps: Modifications to Aedis will be doing some 3-D modeling. Lease-leaseback contract in the works. Going to the board on 9/17.
- These go to the site staff as a preliminary concept for their input. First meeting in October will be a preliminary view of the design / informational item can go to the 9/17 board meeting.

  Then it can go the staff on the meeting.

#### **FACILITIES & NEW CONSTRUCTION (PAUL NADEAU)**

#### **BROWNELL MS: OWNER FURNISHINGS**

- Measure E
- These are items that the district provides.
- Two microwave ovens and refrigerator for the staff lounge.
- Next steps: This will go the board for approval.

#### **BROWNELL MS: BELSON TRASH RECEPTACLES (OWNER FURNISHED)**

- \$11,852 from Measure E
- 18 pairs of bins. Trash and recycle bins side-by-side.
- Checked with site head custodian, who said more might need a few more but recommended going with this plan to see how they work first.
- Similar to what is at Christopher HS, which have worked well at that site.
- Gilroy HS has a similar request for trash bins, same amount of bins and price. That request will be routed through maintenance and principal for approvals, etc.
- Next steps: This will go the board for approval.

#### **BROWNELL MS: FENCING PROPOSAL/GATES**

- \$83,169.61 from Measure E
- Crusader Fencing
- Fence wrapping around side one First Street. This includes in putting in parking gates.
- Next steps: If approved, this would be handed back to Flint for more accurate pricing.

#### **BROWNELL MS: MEDIA CENTER/6TH-GRADE FURNITURE**

- \$366,720 from Measure E
- KI Furniture
- Only additional soft seating for library, conference room.
- Linda is concerned the backless ottomans invite casual, disruptive gatherings. But because so few are planned, she's OK with continuing.
- More items may be ordered in the future but Paul has asked the school to live with what has now been ordered and installed so any additional orders will be informed decisions.
- Next steps: This will go to the board for approval.

#### **BROWNELL MS: HAZMAT ABATEMENT OF GYM**

- Measure E
- EnviroScience
- First step in getting approved changes started to gym. It will identify any hazardous materials that are present and would need to be removed.

#### **BROWNELL MS: MOUNTED TVS VS. ON CARTS**

- Measure E
- Next steps: This item will be moved to another meeting. David Laboranti, Alvaro and Maribel should be present for discussion.

#### **BROWNELL MS: GREY GATES TO EACH POD**

- Measure E
- Talk to the Aedis. What are options?
- Next steps: This item will be moved to another meeting. Paul will talk to Aedis to develop options.

#### GILROY HS: SOLICITATION OF BIDS FOR COURTYARD PROJECT

- Budget for this part of the project is \$250K. (Overall budget is about \$370K)
- Measure E
- DSA approval is in and this ready to bid. Goal is to get this completed before the Thanksgiving break.
- This is projected to stay within budget. Only item Paul foresees to add to the cost, would be additional work to move power subpanel. The committee would approve this if it's within a reasonable price range.
- Can the committee see the design at the next FSC meeting?
- Next steps: This is approved to go to bid. Paul will send the concepts after this meeting and they'll be presented for review at the next meeting.

#### SOUTH VALLEY MS: CONTRACT FOR GENERAL CONTRACTOR FOR MODERNIZATION PROJECT

- Information item.
- \$70M from Measure E. This is ready to the board for approval.

#### **MAINTENANCE (DAN MCAULIFFE)**

#### **DISTRICT-WIDE: ROOF REPAIRS**

- TREMCO WTI.
- Next steps: This will go the next meeting so Mark Good can hear it.

#### ADB/SCCOE ANNEX: METAL ROOF REPAIR

- Information only.
- Estimated to be about \$34K-\$38K.
- TREMCO

- Metal roof has shifted on this site. The roof may not have been installed properly but the shift
  may have started in the last year. They may be shifting because they were installed correctly. All
  panels that are affected need to be removed and reinstalled.
- Needs to be addressed before winter.
- TREMCO will not provide the repair but will help facilitate bids, vendors, etc.
- How long is roof warrantied? It depends on vendor.
- Next steps: Dan will get the three bids for this project. The proposal will be presented at future FSC meeting.

#### **SOLORSANO MS: WATER DAMAGE**

- \$3,000 to \$4,000 from RRM
- BOSCO
- Caused by HVAC water condensation line.
- The damage was more visual than structural.

#### CHRISTOPHER HS: CONCRETE FLOOR CRACKING

- Information only.
- Cottage Floors
- This issue is in the A wing, upper wing.
- Crack in floor that has become very apparent. The solution is to add band of flooring over the crack. It will reoccur and have to be repaired every three to four years.

#### OTHER PROJECTS/FACILITY ISSUES AT SITES

- **Gilroy HS:** Feral cats have become an issue on this campus. Animal control won't pick them up from the site. This many cats on a site can lead to a flea problem, similar to what happened at Mt. Madonna HS. Maintenance is working on solutions for this.
- **District-wide**: Every site has at least five handwashing stations. We've received part of our soap order; the rest is on back order. Twenty-five handwashing stations are in Maintenance yard that still need to be distributed. All sites have glass panels in lobbies. More are on their way. Portable partitions are here (800); about 40 have been distributed. Three-sided partitions are ordered but not delivered yet. Social distancing stencils are being painted throughout. Stickers and A-frames are available as well. This will be shared with health subcommittee. Only concerns are with staffing.
- **Gilroy HS:** At least one break-in recorded has been recorded at the new pool. The concern is that the chemicals are balanced for hibernation, not pool use right now and anyone who gets in the water can experience skin irritation. The only people allowed on the deck are the two pool techs and Dr. Flores. Coach Pickford has gone in to clean up his office and storage area. When will the pool be ready to be occupied? It can be ready within days, as long as we have advance notice. We need to post warning signs while in hibernation mode.

- Current annual payments are approximately \$1.75 million through April 1, 2039

### **General Obligation Bonds**


- District voters have approved three general obligation bond measures, totaling \$389 million of authorization since 2002
- Following the 2019 issuance of bonds in May, there is a total of \$94.68 million in authorized, but unissued bonds from Measure E
  - The District has capacity under its \$60.00 tax rate to issue the remaining authorization to meet project funding needs in 2021

- The District has always been a good steward of taxpayer dollars, looking at new money bond structures to create efficiencies and taking advantage of low interest rates to refinance existing debt
  - In 2013 the District's bond refinancing saved taxpayers \$12 million in interest payments
  - In 2013, the JPA financing structure eliminated the use of Capital Appreciation Bonds, saving taxpayers over \$50 million
  - In 2015, the District's bond refinancing saved taxpayers \$3.8 million in interest payments
  - In 2019, the District refinanced its 2013 JPA Bonds to save taxpayers \$15.27 million in interest payments

- Since 2017, a total of 46 school districts requested a bond capacity waiver and all have received approval from SBE
  - Santa Clara County School Districts include: Alum Rock Union ESD, Franklin-McKinley SD and Luther Burbank SD







# BURKE'S HISTORY

John Edward was a farmer in Fond du Lac, Wisconsin and farmed the land the Burke company headquarters stands on today. In 1920, he incorporated a weather-stripping company that quickly expanded to include the design and production of designer radiator furniture. After receiving a request to fabricate a slide for a family friend, Burke entered the playground industry! Soon playground products were the company's main focus and they introduced Swing King, a residential line of play equipment.

When World War II began, Burke, like many companies, changed their focus to the war effort. J.E. Burke, always an inventor, devised a self-contained ammunition cart that could be parachuted to army personnel. The Parachute, as it was suitably named, was also used to deliver food and medical supplies. The company's dedication earned special recognition, and in 1943, the J.E. 



If a crew has been dispatched to the job site during normal work hours and is unable to perform the agreed upon work due to variables within the customer's control, the customer will be assessed a mobilization fee of \$600.00 for incurred expenses. If this occurs outside of normal business hours, the mobilization fee will be \$900.

**Completion of Contract:** Anderson's Tree Care Specialists, Inc. agrees to do its best to meet any agreed upon performance dates but shall not be liable in damages or otherwise for delays because of inclement weather, labor, or any other cause beyond its control; nor shall the customer be relieved of completion for delays.

Tree Ownership: The authorizing party warrants that all trees listed are located on the customer's property, and, if not, that the authorizing party has received full permission from the owner to allow Anderson's Tree Care Specialists, Inc. to perform the specified work. Should any tree be mistakenly identified as to ownership, the customer agrees to indemnify Anderson's Tree Care Specialists, Inc. for any damages or costs incurred from the result thereof.

**Safety:** Anderson's Tree Care Specialists, Inc. warrants that all arboricultural operations will follow the latest version of the ANSI Z133.1 industry safety standards. The authorizing party agrees to not enter the work area during arboricultural operations unless authorized by the crew leader on-site.

ANSI A300 Tree Care Standard Definitions: The following definitions apply to specifications detailed in this proposal.

Clean: Selective pruning to remove one or more of the following parts: dead, diseased, and/or broken branches. Unless noted otherwise on this proposal, all cleaning will be of branches 1 inch diameter or greater throughout the entire crown.

Crown: The leaves and branches of a tree measured from the lowest branch on the trunk to the top of the tree.

Leader: A dominant or co-dominant, upright stem.

Raise: Selective pruning to provide vertical clearance.

Reduce: Selective pruning to decrease height and/or spread by removing specified branches.

**Restore:** Selective pruning to improve the structure, form, and appearance of trees that have been severely headed, vandalized, or damaged.

Thin: Selective pruning to reduce density of live branches, usually by removing entire branches.

Vista pruning: Selective pruning to allow a specific view, usually by creating view "windows" through the tree's crown.

**Stump Removal:** Unless specified in the proposal, stump removal is not included in the price quoted. Grindings from stump removal are not hauled unless specified in this proposal. Surface and subsurface roots beyond the stump are not removed unless specified in this proposal.



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### Farm Safety Updates Proposal

We are looking to improve the safety of the school farm through improved plumbing and added Wi-Fi for courses and security camera functions.

### **Updated Plumbing**

Swine Barn- Updating the plumbing from PVC to a more durable metal. The hogs frequently are breaking the PVC causing excess costs and potential water damage. The broken pieces of PVC can also be ingested by the animal or cause a laceration. This can lead to infections and more cost on our students and the potential loss of their project. Because there is no one on the farm facility 24/7 many of these damages are not caught for several hours. Better plumbing material and proper mounting will decrease the likelihood of the hogs being able to physically break the pipes. This adds to greater safety for the animals as well as less damage to clean up multiple times a summer.

Sheep and Goat Barns- Updating the plumbing to the sheep and goat barns so that each pen will have an automatic waterer available with a shutoff right behind each pen. This is important because the goats often knock over their buckets and will then be out of water for the majority of the day. Also, when school is in session and it is very warm, they typically drink all of the water in their buckets and are low by 2:00 and students will not be at the farm until their designated evening feeding hour of 6:00. This means that animals are without water during peak heat of the day. By providing plumbing with spigots at each pen, we will be able to set up hanging automatic waterers for each animal, thus ensuring cool and clean water to them at all times of the day.

### Wi-Fi and Security Cameras

Wi-Fi- this is needed at the farm so that courses and summer forms can be filled out. It is our hopes to utilize the farm on a more regular basis for our courses. Now that students are 1-1 with devices, they will be recording notes for observations on their computers. It will also be nice to set up for virtual labs and demonstrations during virtual learning for many of our courses. All entries for fairs are online and filled out with the advisors during the summer, typically at the farm. Until now, we have been using personal hotspots to ensure that all entries are made in a timely manner. This will also help us when instructing our students on livestock evaluation. They will be able to quickly reference videos on their devices and look for similar characteristics in the animals at the farm.

Cameras- These cameras are needed for extra security reasons. It is important to have eyes on all the animals at the farms during all hours of the day. Being that they are living creatures, accidents can happen, and this will allow us to be able to identify if there is something of concern to be addressed.

Cameras will also help with watching the breeding animals when they are close to being due. If an animal is in distress for too long, it can lead to death of the mother and offspring. The cameras will also bring added security at the farm in identifying who may have left an item unlocked or forgot to lock the gate. It is also a great benefit to make sure that only approved members are at the farm (students and parents ONLY). This extra level of security would be a great benefit. As both advisors do not live in town, it is an added level of security for us to be able to keep eyes on the farm and ensure that everyone/thing is safe, even from a greater distance.
